Social Learning Theory: Understanding Bandura's Theory of ...

The social learning theory proposed by Albert Bandura has become perhaps the most influential theory of learning and development While rooted in many of the basic concepts of traditional learning theory, Bandura believed that direct reinforcement could not account for all types of learning

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Background: Social Learning Theory

- Social learning theory or SLT is the theory that people learn new behaviour through observational learning of the social factors in their environment If people observe positive, desired outcomes in the observed behaviour, then they are more likely to model, imitate, and adopt the behaviour themselves
